I had an aquarium as a child and all my life I have loved fish. They move very slow and they don't worry.

Of all the pets in the world the Betta is the least expensive. A one gallon glass jug is very adequate for a single betta. A two gallon fish bowl is better. Bettas like a little protection in their home. Personally I use a bit of plastic plant because it is so much easier than real plants which require a lot of light.

The biggest issue with bettas is the water. Tap water will kill them. You will need to remove the Chlorine and in some cases adjust the ph.

According to Dr. Ross Campbell winner of the presidents award in pediatrics and author of "Kids at Risk" the single greatest danger to your child's health is his own anger. Not only are our children killing each other out of anger the emotion itself raises blood pressure and contributes to many other diseases. The angry child is less likely to make healthy relationships with others and does not digest his or her food properly. We recommend Dr. Campbell's book which though out of print can be obtained at most public libraries. Having a betta gives parents a chance to talk about aggressive behavior and healthy ways to deal with things we fear. God's way of dealing with problems is prayer...not anger. It one of the most valuable lessons we can and must teach.
