
Scripture Box



After you make your box pretend you are inside it. God's word to the left and to the right, God's word above and below, God's word before and behind...God's word SURROUNDING you. (Instructions on page 2) For Scripture Box cut on the gray lines. For cross cut on the black lines.

Scripture Wallet

Fold in the two arms and top section of the cross. Fold the bottom two sections around the top four. Hold in place with an adhesive DOT.



The wonder of the scripture wallet is that children can carry it with them. With all six scriptures on a single theme it is a great week long learning tool.



Guide for Scripture box, wallet and cross.

The lesson in folding the cross as a box is to slip a grain of rice or pea inside just before gluing the box closed. Ask the children to put the box on a shelf in their room and when they are afraid shake it as a reminder that they are surrounded by Christ...and his word...after shaking the box and praying suggest they read one or more verses. There is SAFETY in God's word."

Materials: The secret is in the paper, copy paper works but something a little heavier (24#) might be better. Card stock etc. may be too stiff for children to fold. Other materials are a stapler, scissors and white glue.

1. Cut out the cross
Cut on the gray
lines. Be careful not
to remove the top tab
or side tabs.






2. Fold all the side tabs and the arms of the cross. Be careful to fold them toward the white side of the paper.




3. Fold the trunk of the cross. You should end up with four sections and the top tab. Slide the top tab under the bottom section of the cross.





5. Put two or three SMALL drops of glue on each of the side tabs.





6. Close the box and put on a shelf to dry.

Let it be a REMINDER to surround yourself with God's word.

Scripture Wallet

The lesson in folding the cross as a wallet. Is to suggest to children that "God's riches at Christ's expense" are always available...that no matter their need their FIRST thought should be of prayer and scripture...not money.We especially like the scripture wallet for ministering to street children... or anyone living in poverty.Hope you can forward it to missionary friends and overseas churches.

Making the wallet is so simple. All you need is scissors for each child and a packet of adhesive dots. Fold in the two arms of the cross, fold down the top. Fold the base of the cross twice and wrap it around thee wallet...sealing it with the dot. The point is that Bible Verses are more valuable than money and you should always have some in your pocket.

Scripture Cross

The lesson in cutting out the Scripture Cross as is, is to remind children that without the power of the cross the Bible would be only words. Suggest they display the cross in their home near where they sleep.

Materials: All you need is scissors. Cut out the cross in class or send it home suggesting the children ask their parents to help cut it out and put it on display. VERY FEW THINGS in the Christian life are as important as reminders. This cross has six powerful verses to remind us of THE IMPORTANCE OF BELIEVING.
