A single answered prayer is the one thing most likely to connect a child to God and a church for life.

First make a prayer cup. On one side of a styrofoam cup write "From Me to Jesus". On the other side write "From Jesus to ME'.

Then Each night for a week parent and each child take turns praying a one sentence prayer. First the parent prays one sentence. Then the child prays one sentence. No book can help a child understand so deeply his or her part in prayer. "What I hear I forget. What I see I remember. What I do I understand." After a week help a child write down his or her one sentence prayer and put it in the cup. Explain the two halves of prayer...the first half where we talk to God...and the second half where he talks to us. Put the cup near the child's bed and remind him to pray first thing in the morning and last thing at night. If after a week of praying alone pray with your child. If still no answer involved your pastor and perhaps the whole church. God has promised to answer. Avoid correcting a child's prayer. The goal is to help him or her hear from God not us. But if after a month the child feels there is not an answer from God suggest he go to <u>www.teachustopray.com</u>, click on bulletin insert and then Prayer Mechanics Checklist.

After the child has heard from God take the prayer out of the jar and write the answer on the back. **Thought for leaders.**
